Clemson Engineering Partnership



Clemson University and Southern Wesleyan University will begin a new and unique partnership this coming Fall. It will allow students an opportunity to

begin their academic career by pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Applied Mathematics at SWU, while preparing for an engineering degree from Clemson. Students will spend approximately two years at Southern Wesleyan, earning at least 60 credit hours toward a major in SWU's Applied Mathematics program. The student will then transfer over to Clemson University to complete their engineering degree. While at Clemson, the student will also complete the remaining credits needed for their Southern Wesleyan degree. Once the student completes the program, they will earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Applied Mathematics from SWU and a Bachelor of Science degree in their chosen engineering discipline from Clemson.

"We are so excited about this partnership because of what it means for our students. We often have students inquiring about engineering programs. To be able to have the foundation of a strong Christian liberal arts university and an engineering degree from one of the top engineering programs in the country is a combination any employer would welcome in a graduate," stated Dr. Brian Swords, Vice President of Enrollment Management at SWU.

Master of Science in Counseling Psychology grads



The C. Clifton Wood Master of Science in Counseling Psychology started in January 2021. It was funded by Dr. Wood, who provided the lead gift and is recognized for his love of

Christ and generosity towards those following a call to serve in the field of counseling. This graduate counseling degree gives students essential academic and clinical training with a Christian worldview and biblical perspective. It leads graduates to serve as Licensed Professional Counselors, with a focus on evidence-based and integrative approaches that address the whole person. The MSCP degree responds to the mental health crisis

facing our nation and is making a significant impact in lives through counseling professionals who graduate from SWU.

In December 2022 Kayla Achenbach and Josie Edwards became the first two graduates of the Master of Science in Counseling Psychology from Southern Wesleyan University, and on May 5, 2023 we celebrate David Fields and Samantha Mason as they receive their diplomas.



With a pastor's heart and decades of experience in ministry, Pastor Quint Pitts was born and bred in West Virginia and has served for the last twenty-five years as the founding pastor of one of the largest churches in the state.
